Course Content: Evidence for the effectiveness of SBI for Alcohol and drug-related presentations to health, social care and other settings provision of an overview of the SAOR model of intervention for problem alcohol and drug use. Establishing a supportive working relationship with an individual when asking about their alcohol use and how to screen for alcohol use. Deliver a structured brief intervention based upon the SAOR model.

Learning Outcomes

- Critically discuss problem alcohol and drug use as it impacts their current work or area of practice.
- Demonstrate an enhanced knowledge and awareness of contemporary models of screening and brief intervention for problem alcohol and drug use
- Identify problem alcohol and drug users who present to health, social care settings
- Utilise the SAOR model of Screening & Brief Intervention (SBI) in practice based scenarios
- Discuss the application of the SAOR model of screening and brief intervention for problem alcohol and drug use into their practice

Introduction to Motivational Interviewing

Course Description:

Motivational Interviewing is a psychosocial evidenced based method of intervention in health behaviour change that works on facilitating and engaging intrinsic motivation within the client in order to change behavior. MI is a goal-oriented, client-centered counseling style for eliciting behavior change by helping clients to explore and resolve ambivalence.

Course Content:

- Assess and apply appropriate intervention skills along the continuum of alcohol and other drug use.
- Provide opportunity to enhance participants' practice skills
- Explore the fundamentals of Motivational Interviewing:
 - Spirit of MI
 - OARS
 - Ability to elicit and develop change talk
 - Response to change / sustain talk

Learning Outcomes

- Critically reflect on personal values and belief systems
- Enhancement of MI practitioner skills

Certification / Accreditation: Certificate of attendance will be awarded on completion of the training.

Essential Group Facilitation Skills

Course Duration: 2 days

This course is aimed at those working in the Community/Voluntary/Drugs/Alcohol sector that are involved in or plan to become involved in the facilitation of a range of groups.

Course Description: Facilitation is the theory and practice combined of working with people. Facilitation enables and empowers people to carry out a task or perform an action. A group facilitator uses certain skills in a process, which allows the individuals/group reach their decision/ set their goal/learn a skill or what ever the task at hand might be. Facilitation is a developmental educational method, which encourages people to share ideas, resources, opinions and to think critically in order to identify needs and find effective ways of satisfying those needs.

Course Content:

- To evaluate, recognize and put into practice the theory & practice of group work founded on the principles and values of group facilitation
- How to organise, plan, run and facilitate and evaluate group sessions with parameters, boundaries and group agreements.
- Identify power, conflict and lack of participation in a group and how best to manage difficult situations.
- Develop an insight into ethical behaviour as a facilitator and the use of your own power in the facilitator's role.

Certification / Accreditation:

A certificate of attendance will be awarded on completion of the training.

Alcohol Drugs and Young People : Working with young people, early intervention.

- Understand teenage brain development.
- Understand risk and protective factors.
- Outline the impact of Substance Use Disorder on young people, families & communities.
- Approach alcohol & drug issues from an informed perspective.
- Provide an early brief intervention for alcohol or other drug use.
- Identify key agencies and supports for young people experiencing difficulties

Certification / Accreditation:

A certificate of attendance will be awarded on completion of the training.

Women and Substance Use

Course Duration: 3 hrs

Course Description: There are gender-related issues when it comes to women's problem substance use concerning unique biological factors as well as differences in social and environmental factors all of which can influence the motivations for alcohol or other drug use. Seeking treatment may be more complex for women, which may result in waiting longer to access treatment. Research has shown that physical and sexual trauma followed by post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) may be more common in drug-abusing women than in men seeking treatment.

Course Content:

- Alcohol Consumption and the female body.
- Impact of alcohol and other drug use in pregnancy.
- Issues relating to women's alcohol & other drug use and its impact on accessing treatment earlier.
- Women as influencers

Learning Outcomes

- Explore and understand the complex set of issues involved with women and alcohol and / or other drug use
- Understand the implications of alcohol or other drug consumption during pregnancy
- Gain knowledge on the complex set of issues face when seeking treatment for substance use disorder
- Demonstrate how woman as influencers can inform the younger generation of risk
